The Management of the University of Rwanda is delighted to inform the public that under the Priority Skills for Growth (PSG) program implemented by the Government of Rwanda in partnership with the World Bank it has developed and got accreditation for the following two new undergraduate programs:

1. Bachelor of Science with Honours in Procurement, Logistics and Supply Chain Management
2. Bachelor of Science with Honours in Transport Management

The University of Rwanda is therefore inviting applications from both privately and government sponsored candidates who wish to study either during **day** and/or **evening** hours for the above programs offered by School of Business, Department of Procurement, Logistics and Transport at the College of Business and Economics-Gikondo Campus.

All candidates are advised to apply online as described on the UR website ([www.admissions.ur.ac.rw](http://www.admissions.ur.ac.rw)). The Online application system is open and will be closed on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2020 Midnight. For this reason all candidates are advised to pay the required admission fees and submit their applications before that time. Since the registration will also follow thereafter candidates who will get admitted will be required to register and should be ready start classes early March 2020.

**NOTE:** While privately sponsored candidates are encouraged to apply, we also encourage eligible candidates who wish to get government sponsorship to apply.
