1. INTRODUCTION

The Center of Excellence in Biodiversity and Natural Resource Management (CoEB) was launched in 2017 as a research center in the University of Rwanda. As a UNESCO Category II Center, CoEB acts as a clearing house for data and information on biodiversity and natural resources and promotes the understanding, monitoring and cataloging of biodiversity, ecosystem functioning and services, climate change impacts and adaptation, and science-policy linkages. The CoEB supports Rwanda to address impacts of climate change and natural hazards, management of natural resources, loss of biodiversity, ecosystem services, and environmentally sustainable economic development. Its mission is to enhance the knowledge of biodiversity and natural resource management for sustainable development.

- Oversee the collection, treatment, recording and ensure proper storage of new specimens
- Coordination of visits to the National Herbarium by students, international and national partner and stakeholders
- Produce a monthly report on the achievements (e.g., new specimens collected, recorded and stored in the herbarium collection, students trained, research hosted)
- Share data to the Rwanda Biodiversity information system
- Make a presentation in research seminar about the achievements 2 times per year
- Create an active research environment and conduct research relevant to plant diversity



- Write at least three proposals for funding (research or herbarium project)
- Maintain partnerships and networks to help grow the National Herbarium of Rwanda
- Ensure the website of the National Herbarium of Rwanda is functioning and serving current herbarium needs and outreach activities
- Maintain active programs for education with schools and partners, with interns and visiting researchers
- Ensure National Herbarium of Rwanda policies are updated and available
