# Call for application for MSc scholarship in Plant Science or Forest Science areas at University of Rwanda

# I. Background

The University of Rwanda in partnership with the University of Gothenburg has obtained a funding to conduct a research that aims to study the sensitivity of tropical tree species to heat and drought (project title: "climate sensitivity and reforestation of tropical trees").

#### II. Role and description

The project has 3 specific aims:

- (1) To identify which tree traits that control the vitality and survival of tropical trees exposed to warmer and/or drier conditions.
- (2) To identify which groups of tree species that have the lowest capacity to acclimate to increased temperature and reduced.
- (3) To deliver maps with recommendations on which tree species that are suitable for plantation in various parts of Rwanda. The project has experimental sites (forest plantations) established at Ibanda Makera (Kirehe District), Rubona (Huye District) and Sigira (Nyamagabe District).

# III. Call for application

Under project management by Single Project Implementation Unit of the University of Rwanda (SPIU-UR), we call for applicants for one fully funded MSc scholarship. After successful recruitment, the selected applicant will register for MSc in an existing master program at the University of Rwanda, which will be related to plant science or forest science.

#### IV. Funding

The successful candidate will be funded for tuition fee, monthly living allowances, field allowances (mission fee), and any other research expenses with UR standards.

#### V. Application requirements

Applicant must have obtained a BSc degree with Fist Class Honors (average marks on transcripts  $\geq$  80%), in the areas of biology, plant sciences, forest sciences:

- (1) Having an experience in conducting field data collection in plant science or forest sciences is an added value: this will be evidenced by training certificates, work certificate;
- (2) Having published a research paper is another added value.

Candidates have to be Rwandan citizens

- (2) Motivation letter addressing commitment, statement of goals, and reasons for undertaking MSc program;
- (3) Curriculum vitae
- (4) Copies of BSc degree and transcripts
- (5) Copy of national identification card
- (6) One recommendation letter from lecturers or other staff who know professionally the applicants
- (7) Any copy of professional training certificate.

#### Selection criteria

A written exam and interview will be organized
