1. INTRODUCTION

The University of Rwanda-Single Project Implementation Unit (SPIU) is implementing various projects aimed at enhancing research capacity, Infrastructure development, and service delivery. The University is implementing a Research project in collaboration with the Disability Data Initiative Sub-Saharan Africa (DDI-SSA) and the South African Medical Research Council (SAMRC), with an aim to advance the quality, availability, and use of disability data to promote inclusive human development and drive evidence-based policymaking across Africa.

The University of Rwanda-Single Project Implementation Unit (UR-SPIU) is inviting qualified and interested applicants to apply for the position of Research Assistant to contribute to impactful research that fosters disability-inclusive practices and knowledge development.

2. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Conduct high-quality research and analysis of disability data.
- Collaborate with researchers, policymakers, and stakeholders to support DDI's objectives.
- Publish findings in reputable journals and present at academic conferences.
- Assist in developing research proposals and securing funding for future initiatives.
- Contribute to the development of innovative tools for disability data collection and analysis.
- Support the establishment of a national disability database and prepare a Special Needs and Disability Mainstreaming Report for Rwanda, with a special focus on the University of Rwanda.

3. REQUIRED SKILLS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- Completed or submitted PhD in disability studies, inclusive education/development, rehabilitation studies, statistics, epidemiology, economics, or a related discipline.
- Exceptional candidates with a master's degree in a relevant field will also be considered.

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- Demonstrated experience in disability research, disability statistics, or disability-inclusive programming.
- Strong analytical and research skills; willingness to use and learn statistical software packages.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills in English and at least one other African language.
- Ability to work collaboratively within a multidisciplinary team.
