Post-Doctoral Fellowship at Brighton and Sussex Medical School

Background

The Department of Global Health and Infection at Brighton & Sussex Medical School (BSMS), in collaboration with the University of Rwanda, has obtained a grant from the UK National Institute for Health Research, to conduct research on severe stigmatizing skin diseases from a social science perspective (2019-2023).

This project entitled: Social Sciences for Severe Stigmatizing Skin Diseases (The 5-S Foundation) aims to end neglect of two stigmatizing skin diseases (podoconiosis and scabies) in Rwanda through bringing the social sciences to bear on these conditions by identifying interventions informed by social science perspectives at the level of the patient, the community, and national & international policy.

As part of this partnership, we are looking for a Post-Doctoral Research Fellow (PDRF) to work with the 5-S Foundation team.

The PDRF holder will work on the evaluation of an existing intervention or the development of a new intervention directed at podoconiosis patients in Rwanda. S/he will closely work with PDRFs in Ethiopia, Sudan and the UK, and PhD students within Rwanda.

- 1. In close collaboration with the 5-S team and counterparts, coordinate research deliverables
- 2. Provide technical and conceptual support to a PhD project
- Provide technical support to the UK-based 5-S PDRF's research on national and global NTD policy.
- 4. Contribute more broadly to health and social science capacity development in project partner countries including Sudan and Ethiopia.
- 5. Develop research objectives and proposals for own or joint research, at acceptable levels, with assistance if required.
- 6. Conduct research projects individually and in collaboration with others.
- 7. Analyse and interpret research findings and draw conclusions from the outcomes
- 8. Produce high-quality research outputs for publication in monographs or recognised high-quality journals, or performance/exhibition, as appropriate
- 9. Contribute to the preparation of proposals and applications to external bodies, for example for funding purposes.
