ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE WRITTEN RESULTS FOR DATA COLLECTORS WHO APPLIED TO WORK ON RESEARCH PROJECTS

Reference is made to the advert dated November 26, 2019, where the University of Rwanda through its Single Project Implementation Unit, advertised a call for data collectors. The shortlisting results were published on March 2nd, 2020 and the written exams were administrated through moodle from March 9th to March 13th, 2020.

After compilation of exam results per domain, out of 3,935 candidates who were called for written exam, only 1,322 candidates attended (34%). 490 candidates have got the required marks for oral as indicated by the table below:

They will be contacted later so that they are informed on when they will sit for another written exam. Apologies for any inconveniences caused.

Next steps for the database

1. Candidates who scored 50% and above in written exam are retained to be part of the database of data collectors of UR-SPIU;
2. Upon a formal request from Project Coordinators or Principal Investigators to have enumerators, candidates in the database will be contacted for oral interviews starting with those with the highest score;
3. Those who will score on average of 70% (both written & oral) will be given an employment contract whose length and remuneration will be determined by the planned and the available budget within the respective project.
4. Contracting process will ensure that no candidate is employed more than once before the list is exhaustive;
5. The database will be kept for a period of 2 years;
