Summary of the post

Countries in Africa and South Asia face unprecedented challenges in relation to sustainable development, whether managing the effects of inequality and poverty, rapid urbanisation or the increasing risks posed by natural disasters linked to climate change. Education has enormous potential to act as a driver for sustainable development (SD) and the education SDG (Goal 4) is central to the realisation of the other SDGs. The 'wicked problem' that education systems face is how to simultaneously address the current learning crisis whilst transforming education systems to become drivers of SD. This challenge must be addressed simultaneously across all sectors of education and training systems and at global, regional, national and local scales.

We believe that education can act as a driver for sustainable change but in order to do so, education systems themselves need to be radically transformed. Our vision, consistent with global, regional and national agendas, is for systems of

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life-long learning that can provide learners with the skills, competencies, values and transformative agency required to meet the challenges of environmentally sustainable and socially just development. The overall goal of TES4SD is to develop understanding of how education systems can act as drivers of sustainable development in India, Rwanda, Somalia and South Africa. This goal will be realized the following objectives:

Project Objectives

Objective one

Develop a sustainable network of researchers based in universities, NGOs, government departments and Community Based Organisations CBOs with the capacity to undertake rigorous transdisciplinary, innovative, impactful research facilitated through the work of four national hubs in India, Rwanda, Somalia and South Africa.

Objective two

Synthesise and disseminate existing and emerging knowledge about the nature of SD and how it shapes the need for transformative education system change.

Objective three

Co-produce the evidence and arguments urgently needed to transform education and training systems so that they become drivers of socially and environmentally just development.

We will primarily consider education through the lens of four SDGS: sustainable jobs and economic growth (SDG8), sustainable cities and communities (SDG11), responsible production and consumption (SDG12), and climate action (SDG13). As a secondary focus, understanding will be developed of the relationships between education and poverty (SDG1), gender equality (SDG5), reduced inequalities (SDG10), peace, justice and strong institutions (SDG16) and partnerships (SDG17).

Major roles and responsibilities

- Support the project team in management of project data.
- Maintain updates on project activities as per developed research plans.
- In collaboration with the project team, monitor projects progress towards project outputs.
- Contribute to the development of project synthesis reports
