The University of Rwanda, CBE—School of Economics, in collaboration with the University of Gothenburg, Sweden is offering a four-year PhD program in Economics by coursework. The program bridges the existing gap between economic theory and practice and enhances a better understanding of the economy and it designs appropriated evidence-based policies for economic performance and economic development. The program trains both qualified lecturers in higher learning institutions in Rwanda and competent researchers. The program receives candidates from Rwanda, East Africa, and the whole Africa.

# I. Entry requirements

To be admitted to doctoral studies in Economics, the student must:

- 1. Have attended a master's degree (level 6 in the Rwanda Qualification Framework) in Economics by coursework with upper division second-class honours or equivalent.
- 2. Have a Master Degree in Economics by coursework with lower division second class and 2 years' working experience.
- 3. Have a Master Degree, upper division in Statistics, Mathematics, Engineering, Agricultural Economics, Quantitative Economics, and other related fields
- 4. Demonstrate sufficient ability to undertake doctoral-level studies in English.

- 1. A cover letter indicating the motivation to join the program.
- 2. A detailed curriculum vitae
- 3. A notarized degree or equivalent from HEC
- 4. Notarized academic transcripts.
- 5. Two recommendation letters from 2 academic referees who are knowledgeable about the applicant,
- 6. Copy of the national identity card
- 7. A PhD Research proposal/Concept note
